## Who Do Others Say I Am?

As we were leaving an officer's meeting, I looked at Marc George riding off on his Victory and thought; "I used to be cool like that." He was all decked in black leather, 1/2 helmet, face in the wind and his "cut" out there for all to see. Yeah, that was me once. Now I'm older. Traded the Wide Glide, do-rag and leather for a Road King. Full face helmet, Hi-Vis armored tech-jacket, and I chant AMGATT. I still wear my cut every time I get on the bike, but I have gone from biker to motorcyclist.

### 1 Corinthians 9 (MSG)

*19-23 Even though I am free of the demands and expectations of everyone, I have voluntarily become a servant to any and all in order to reach a wide range of people: religious, nonreligious, meticulous moralists, loose-living immoralists, the defeated, the demoralized—whoever. I didn't take on their way of life. I kept my bearings in Christ—but I entered their world and tried to experience things from their point of view. I've become just about every sort of servant there is in my attempts to lead those I meet into a God-saved life. I did all this because of the Message. I didn't just want to talk about it; I wanted to be in on it!*

With that in mind, Biker, Motorcyclist, Husband, Teacher, none of that matters in the scheme of things. Because if nobody knows I'm a Christian, what have I accomplished? I read through several versions of 1 Corinthians 9 before I settled on the message. Although this verse

seems a little "heavy handed" in the middle I liked the way it worded a few phrases:

First: Voluntarily become a servant to any and all—The coolest thing about Jesus is that He saved us for no good reason. Yeah, yeah, yeah...He saved us because He loves us. I get that. But I was most definitely unworthy of salvation outside of Jesus' love for me. After that, He asks us to model His example of loving the world, and to show others His love for them. Sure there are commands and directives, suggestions and examples of how to do this; but you can be saved and not really be out there being an effective witness for Christ. We **voluntarily become servants to any and all.**

Jesus said, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments". No threat, no de-

mand, just a statement. That's why Paul uses the word voluntary.

While on a mission trip to Calgary, we went to a football game. I was wearing a team jersey and eating popcorn. The guy next to me says, "excuse me, I don't mean to offend, but are you a biker?" YES! I've still got it. If I can dress like a Canadian football fan and still be thought of as a biker... I win!



### But do they know I'm a Christian?

I was talking to one of the teachers at school. The teacher is a friend, and an annual RFTS supporter...not a Christian, and there were a few of our students around and they noticed my binky, so I got the opportunity to explain it, and CMA. One of the girls looks at me and says, "You're a Christian?" I said, "Sure, why not?" The teacher laughed and said it was because I look like a biker she didn't think I could be a Christian. The girl just nodded her head.

Which gets me to the second part of the wording that I really like in this verse: **I didn't want to just talk about it, I wanted to be in on it.** And the whole reason that we want to be in on it, is in the middle somewhere; **lead those I meet to a God-saved life.** And in retrospect, I

would have to say that in the 4 days of freshman camp that I knew this girl, I failed her. In my mind, people should know that I am a Christian first and foremost. That doesn't mean that I walk up to them and say, "Hi, I'm a Christian." But it does mean, that if I can look like a Canadian football fan and immediately be seen as a biker, why can't I be a teacher, or a soccer coach – or – a biker, and immediately be seen as a Christian. Something in my actions, should speak out to others that says Hey! I am different.

*1 Corinthians 13:1 says that I can have all of this other stuff, but if I don't have love, it profits me nothing.*

And back in

*John 13:34-35. Jesus says that they will know we are His by our love.*

I'm guessing, that my failure is a lack of love. I have love, I'm guessing that maybe at times I'm not showing it. I have been around people, who I immediately "sense" something. What I sensed, depended on the person...I'm sure you know what I mean. So...my goal, is to spend more time trying to show love. Maybe – as I'm on the bike, or in the classroom, or at a Canadian football game; if love is my goal people will pick up on Jesus sooner.





## Fear Not

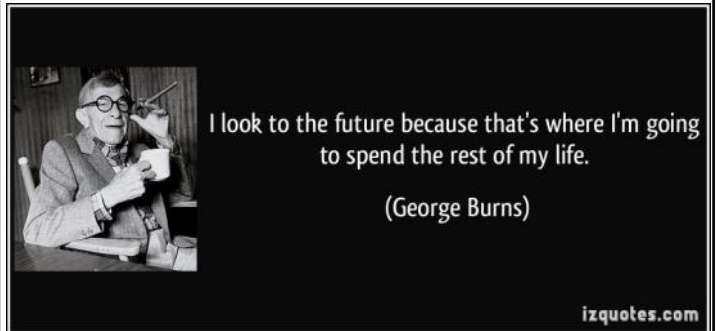
*2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! (NIV)*

*Jeremiah 29:11 —For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.*

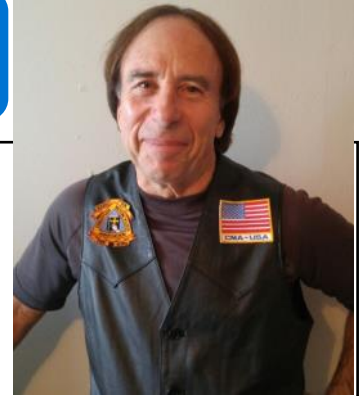

I know I have often struggled with the "How to?"

We read in Galatians 5:22-23 about the nine manifestations God's character is revealed through us: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness and temperance.

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" Romans 15:13

### Longsuffering (patience)

We are "strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness." Colossians 1:11

### Gentleness (kindness)

We should live "in purity, understanding, patience and kindness; in the Holy Spirit and in sincere love; in truthful speech and in the power of God; with weapons of righteousness in the right hand and in the left." 2 Corinthians 6:6-7

### Goodness

"Wherefore also we pray always for you, that our God would count you worthy of this calling, and fulfill all the good pleasure of His goodness, and the work of faith with power" 2 Thessalonians 1:11

"For the Fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth." Ephesians 5:9

### Faith (faithfulness)

"O Lord, thou art my God; I will exalt thee, I will praise thy name; for thou hast done wonderful things; thy counsels of old are faithfulness and truth." Isaiah 25:1

"I pray that out of His glorious riches He may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith." Ephesians 3:16-17

### Meekness

"Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such a one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted." Galatians 6:1

"With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love." Ephesians 4:2

### Temperance (self-control)

"But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance Godliness, to Godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love." 2 Peter 1:5-7

In my walk with our Master Jesus Christ, I have learned that I need to pray, pray, pray, read and confess aloud His Word. And relying on the Holy Spirit's help, I put all the effort I possibly can into being a doer of God's Word and not just a hearer.

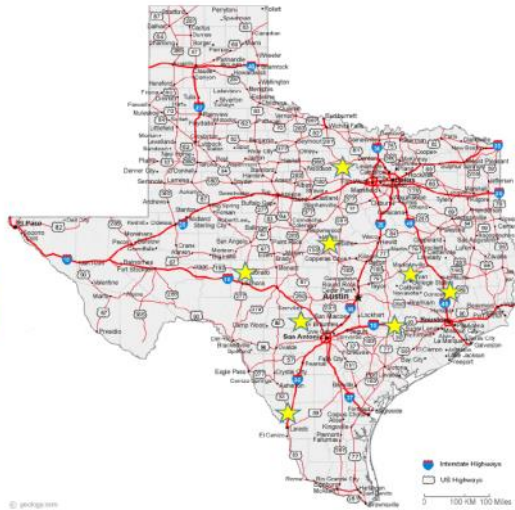

1 point each for 100 mile towns: (and by 100 miles I mean -ish)

Goldthwaite, Hondo, Columbus, College Station

2 points each for 200 mile towns: (and again...-ish applies)

Ex: Graham, Eldorado, Laredo, Conroe

3 points for each border state

AR, LA, NM, OK,

### Fellowship Incentive

2 bonus points if you ride with other NLR members who are not related by blood or marriage.

### Mileage

Send Louis a picture of your current/beginning mileage. Give Louis periodic updates at the Chapter Meetings.

Present your bike on December 4 for a final mileage reading.

Awards will be given for 10, 15 and 20K

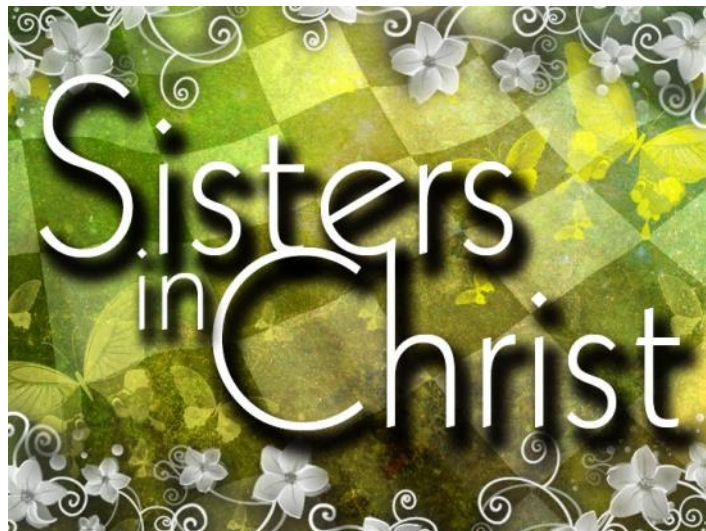

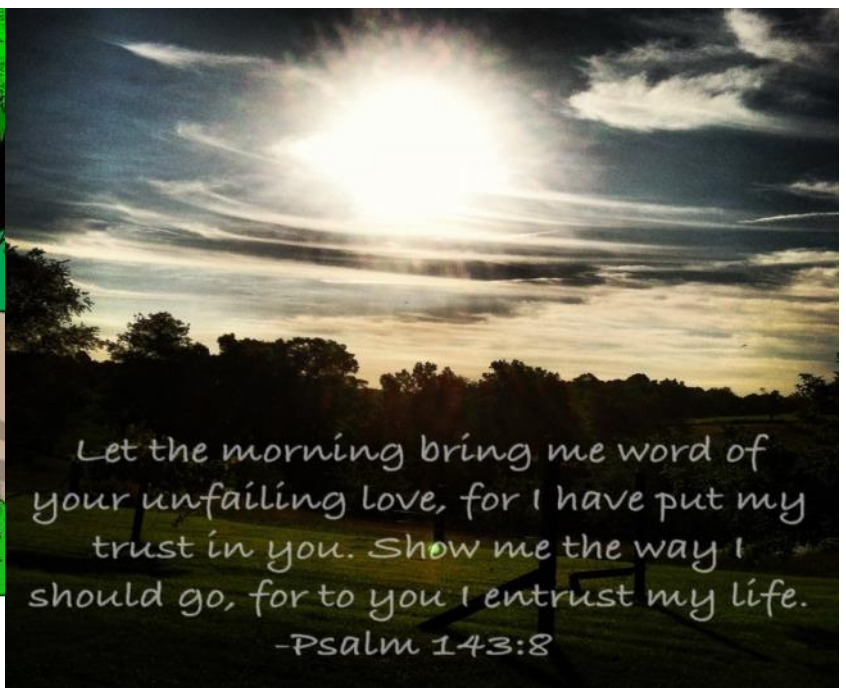


