Who Do Others Say I Am?

As we were leaving an officer's meeting, I looked at Marc George riding off on his Victory and thought; "I used to be cool like that." He was all decked in black leather, ½ helmet, face in the wind and his "cut" out there for all to see. Yeah, that was me once. Now I'm older. Traded the Wide Glide, do-rag and leather for a Road King. Full face helmet, Hi-Vis armored tech-jacket, and I chant AMGATT. I still wear my cut every time I get on the bike, but I have gone from biker to motorcyclist.

1 Corinthians 9 (MSG)

19-23 Even though I am free of the demands and expectations of everyone. I have voluntarily become a servant to any and all in order to reach a wide range of people: religious, nonreligious, meticulous moralists, loose-living immoralists, the defeated, the demoralized—whoever. I didn't take on their way of life. I kept my bearings in Christ—but I entered their world and tried to experience things from their point of view. I've become just about every sort of servant there is in my attempts to lead those I meet into a God-saved life. I did all this because of the Message. I didn't just want to talk about it: I wanted to be in on it!

With that in mind, Biker, Motorcyclist, Husband, Teacher, none of that matters in the scheme of things. Because if nobody knows I'm a Christian, what have I accomplished? I read through several versions of 1 Corinthians 9 before I settled on the message. Although this verse

seems a little "heavy handed" in the middle I liked the way it worded a few phrases:

First: Voluntarily become a servant to

any and all- The coolest thing about Jesus is that He saved us for no good reason. Yeah, yeah, ...He saved us because He loves us. I get that. But I was most definitely unworthy of salvation outside of Jesus' love for me. After that, He asks us to model His example of loving the world, and to show others His love for them. Sure there are commands and directives, suggestions and examples of how to do this; but you can be saved and not really be out there being an effective witness for Christ. We voluntarily become servants to any and all. Jesus said, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments". No threat, no de-

mand, just a statement. That's why Paul uses the word voluntary.

While on a mission trip to Calgary, we went to a football game. I was wearing a team jersey and eating popcorn. The guy next to me says, "excuse me, I don't mean to offend, but are you a biker?" YES! I've still got it. If I can dress like a Canadian football fan and still be thought of as a biker... I win!



But do they know I'm a Christian?

I was talking to one of the teachers at school. The teacher is a friend, and an annual RFTS supporter...not a Christian, and there were a few of our students around and they noticed my binky, so I got the opportunity to explain it, and CMA. One of the girls looks at me and says, "You're a Christian?" I said, "Sure, why not?" The teacher laughed and said it was because I look like a biker she didn't think I could be a Christian. The girl just nodded her head.

Which gets me to the second part of the wording that I really like in this verse: I didn't want to just talk about it, I wanted to be in on it. And the whole reason that we want to be in on it, is in the middle somewhere; lead those I meet to a God-saved life. And in retrospect, I

would have to say that in the 4 days of freshman camp that I knew this girl, I failed her. In my mind, people should know that I am a Christian first and foremost. That doesn't mean that I walk up to them and say, "Hi, I'm a Christian." But it does mean, that if I can look like a Canadian football fan and immediately be seen as a biker, why can't I be a teacher, or a soccer coach – or – a biker, and immediately be seen as a Christian. Something in my actions, should speak out to others that says Hey! I am different.

1 Corinthians 13:1 says that I can have all of this other stuff, but if I don't have love, it profits me nothing.

And back in

John 13:34-35, Jesus says that they will know we are His by our love.

I'm guessing, that my failure is a lack of love. I have love, I'm guessing that maybe at times I'm not showing it. I have been around people, who I immediately "sense" something. What I sensed, depended on the person...I'm sure you know what I mean. So...my goal, is to spend more time trying to show love. Maybe – as I'm on the bike, or in the classroom, or at a Canadian football game; if love is my goal people will pick up on Jesus sooner.

This article will be short because it could be much, much longer. And you do not want that. Do you remember a song titled "He Keeps Me Singing"? The first stanza goes like this:

filled with songs of praise and prayer to God cannot accept thoughts of evil or anxiety.


One more Scripture verse written by Paul tells us in that the peace of God can help us.

looked forward and kept his eyes on God he would not have gone thru all that he did.



I haven't seen much of it. Maybe you're in the same boat. So here is a list of cities or towns, a starting point if you will, a challenge, to go see Texas. And points wise, there's an encouragement for fellowship.

Ride Texas

So, I know it's a little late in the year. But ride season is coming upon us. So I figured better late than never. Since it wasn't broke, I didn't fix it. I did however modify some of the finer points. Consider this the 2.0 version. Each city only counts once.

Here are the 2 rules.

You have to do it on a bike.

We need photographic evidence posted to the NLR Facebook page.

Here are the points:

1 point each for 100 mile towns: (and by 100 miles I mean -ish)

Goldthwaite, Hondo, Columbus, College Station

2 points each for 200 mile towns: (and again...-ish applies)

Ex: Graham, Eldorado, Laredo, Conroe

3 points for each border state

AR, LA, NM, OK,

Fellowship Incentive

<u>2 bonus points</u> if you ride with other NLR members who are not related by blood or marriage.

Mileage

Send Louis a picture of your current/beginning mileage. Give Louis periodic updates at the Chapter Meetings.

Present your bike on December 4 for a final mileage reading.

Awards will be given for 10, 15 and 20K




